Artists make **drawings** by using a pencil or charcoal to draw a picture on a piece of paper or another smooth surface.

Artists make **paintings** by using a paintbrush to paint on a piece of paper, canvas, or other material.

Photographers make photographs with cameras. Photographers like to use light and shadow to make their photographs more interesting. Artists make **collages** by gluing or taping different materials onto a surface to make a picture or pattern. You can use lots of interesting material to make a collage, such as plastic, fabric, metal, or shells.

Sculptors make **sculptures** by carving wood or stone, or by shaping clay. Some sculptors also make sculptures by joining metal, wire, or other materials together to make a shape or figure.
